Learning outcomes of the course unit:

By completing the course, the student will be able to:

- *distinguish, interpret and compare political ideologies*
- explain the origin, internal development of individual ideological directions and their partial concepts as well as their response to the challenges of newer ideological directions, the relationship of ideologies to social classes and their reaction to the weakening of class identity
- analyze the statements and actions of political actors from the point of view of their connection with political ideologies and their specific forms and versions, and thus better explain their overall actions
- use expanded knowledge of political thinking in the field of contemporary political ideologies, and understand the wider social context in which it is formed
- summarize, evaluate, defend and constructively discuss your knowledge and opinions with the help of relevant arguments and present them in a cultured manner, in written or oral form, before a professional or lay audience.
- critically assess current ideological trends in society and politics
- solve selected problems/tasks related to theoretical questions of political ideologies in an original way, in a broader context and taking into account the shared knowledge of related scientific disciplines
- prepare opinions on issues of political ideologies with use in political parties, non-governmental and international organizations.
