By completing the course, the student will be able to:

- explain theories and concepts of political culture and value conflicts, also using knowledge from other scientific disciplines, such as sociology and history, and recognizes the interdisciplinary overlap of these phenomena

- 5. Ronald Inglehart and changes in values in modern and postmodern societies
- 6. Samuel Huntington and the vision of the clash of civilizations
- 7. Value conflicts in companies; social cleavages and their political representation (Lipset and Rokkan)
- 8. The onset of identity politics
- 9. Ronald Inglehart and the value explanation of the rise of the extreme right in Western countries; authoritarian populism as a challenge to liberal democracy
- 10. Political participation of citizens in Slovakia
- 11. Post-communist transformation in CEE and its mutual relationship with political culture
